Lambley Nature: April 2025 Wildlife Tips

The cold nights we have experienced in March will make way to warmer nights in April.

Frogs are late spawning in the east midlands this year so you may see frogspawn this month. On warm days bumble bees will be flying – plants like pulmonaria (lungwort) are a nectar bank for them. Primroses and Cowslips will also start emerging.

If you like to have a spring 'tidy-up', rather than having bonfires or taking it all to the recycling centre, try to move leaf litter mindfully to a compost heap, or to a quiet corner of your garden. Have a close look and you'll probably see lots of lovely little insects and bugs! Woodlice, earwigs, spiders, beetles, ladybirds, millipedes, caterpillars etc., are all part of your garden's eco-system!

- · Why not plant some sunflowers in pots? Fun for all the family and the seeds are good for birds!
- · Mason bees will be emerging so put a bee box in a sunny location on a wall these bees will not sting you either so no problems near children and are amazing pollinators as are night flying moths.
- · Most birds will start nesting this month they will find natural moss, don't be tempted to give them hair from your dog as it can transfer the insecticide found in flea treatment to the nestlings and kill them.
- · When cutting your grass always try to rake it first before cutting, this removes the dead thatch and there maybe frogs or toads hiding within it. Many toads are killed each year by strimmers.
- · You could also plant up bigger containers with nectar-rich flowers, which attract pollinators with their scents and bright colours.
- · Birds will still be nesting and need energy for raising chicks, top up birdfeeders and change water in your fountains regularly, please don't cut hedges, this can make a bird leave the nest through disturbance and attract predators to it!
 - · What about planting some climbers or letting ivy grow naturally? This beneficial plant provides shelter, shade and nectar for many insects.

My father Michael 'Mike' Morris sadly passed away on 2nd December 2024 aged 73.

Mike was a Lambley man. He moved to the village in the early 1990s and adored having such beautiful countryside on his doorstep. He commuted into Nottingham to work as a solicitor and loved nothing more than to get home to Lambley and "get a blast of fresh air" by walking across the fields in the evenings and weekends.

Gardening was also a passion, he loved to potter in his garden, chatting to those who walked past. He was a modest man, never one to blow his own trumpet and, as was typical of him - claimed he didn't know much about gardening; but he did really, and loved to see his garden bloom.

When he retired, he become more active in volunteering in the village, joining and then chairing Lambley Parish Council and becoming a school governor at Lambley School.

Volunteering came naturally to him, as a young man he was heavily involved in youth work, working at The Ark in St Anns and helping to set up Stonebridge City Farm.

In retirement, he also used the skills he gained working as a solicitor for 30 years, to become a member of Nottingham Prison Monitoring Board. Prisoners didn't faze him, he was at ease talking to anyone, from all walks of life.

His last few years were challenging for him. He had been "putting up with Parkinson's" for about 10 years, but in the last few years he developed dementia too. He was frustrated by his illnesses and the limitations they put on him. He couldn't always go for walks, socialise or indeed help others in the way he had previously so enjoyed. But he was never one to complain and was unfailingly polite, kind and still retained his sense of humour.

On behalf of Mike's family, I'd thank to thank all those who were so kind to him in the village - those who popped by the check on him and helped him when he was in need.

Despite his illnesses, he remained devoted to his family – my brothers Lance, Sammy and me and particularly to his nine grandchildren who he adored. He liked nothing more than throwing a ball around in the garden, pushing them on the swing or curling up to read a story.

He was a sports fan all his life. A patient devotee of Middlesbrough FC and the England cricket team, he was often found at Trent Bridge Cricket Club or glued to Sky Sports.

He also loved literature – particularly Charles Dickens; and laughed over and again at Only Fools and Horses and Billy Connolly.

He was very much an outdoors man at heart, he loved to climb hills – including Roseberry Topping close to where he grew up in North Yorkshire, and in the Lake District where he'd often go on holiday.

I am sure he chose Lambley as his home because of its spectacular views and walks and we are in the process of making arrangements for a tribute to Mike in the village. We'd like to thank the Parish Council – which always had a special place in his heart – for all their help.

We all miss him terribly, but I hope that when people think of my father they will smile and remember him at his best – that's what he would have wanted.




Village Footpath Retrievers





Following last month's photo, I received a lovely email from Christine Doughty who added the following details of her memories of Canon Pearson (featured again in this month's photo) and the rectory.

The photo was taken in 1966, possibly upon his retirement. He served in the RN during WWI. In those days Lambley did not have to share a priest but the Rector was also Chaplain to Lowdham Grange Borstal. The Rectory had extensive grounds and trees with a long drive up to it, so the house itself was completely hidden. The front door looked out on to the lawn with a tennis court - he was a keen player. In the house there was a huge hall and wide staircase. To the left on entry were the servants' quarters and the reception rooms on the right.

During his lifetime he had three servants - Mary Hardy who was his housekeeper, her sister Clarice, and Ethel Ward who were all unmarried. Mary and Clarice lived in, but Ethel lived with her family just past the Woodlark on the Bottom Dumble. Upon his retirement Canon Pearson moved to Sheringham and named his house Blue Peter in recognition of his Navy days. Mary and Clarice lived there with him. When he died in 1972, he was buried in Lambley churchyard. His father, also Henry, was Rector of Lambley before him 1883-1899.



It remains a pleasure to be able to contribute to Lambley Life and provide you an update on Lambley and the surrounding areas. Speeding remains a concern and is a local priority for us. Gedling Safer Neighbourhoods Team (SNT) conduct monthly speeding operations in various areas across the divisional area. However, over the last three months, we have focussed on parking issues outside some schools as part of our day to day operations. Whilst we have not been able to conduct a Police led speeding operation, Cllr Julie Gregory does conduct Community Road Safety (CRS) operation with her own volunteers which is a huge help to the Police and the Community. We aim to be intelligence led and officers will identify suitable locations based on intelligence reports from the public and whilst liaising with local Councillors. As you can imagine, we have to balance our resources to local demand and occasions we have prioritise accordingly. That said, we know speeding remains a concern and we will aim to conduct some police led operations in the near future.

We continue to support the Community Safety Watch (CSW) scheme and Cllr Gregory has a strong contingent of volunteers which also supports our police enforcement initiatives. PCSO Parkinson continues to look for new volunteers to receive training on the Community Road Safety training so if you would like to get involved please get in touch with him at Trevor.Parkinson@notts.police.uk.

For clarification, CRS is usually a policing led initiative, but Cllr Gregory has received training whereby she can support this scheme with her volunteers. CSW is the volunteer led initiative with members of the public and without police involvement.

The team have held a number of monthly Beat surgeries in the last quarterly period across the area and we continue to listen to your issues and concerns. Gedling SNT cover Lambley, Burton Joyce and Stoke Bardolph and we aim to have one Beat Surgery in each of the main areas. We will continue to run Beat Surgery once a month in all three areas on a revolving basis. This is to ensure we the public have fair access to the police and equally importantly, we understand the different concerns our communities face. I am pleased to report the following Beat Surgeries will take place over the next three months:-

Burton Joyce Surgery – Wednesday 2nd April 2025 at 1400 hrs at Burton Joyce Library, Burton Joyce, Nottinghamshire

Lambley Beat Surgery – Monday 12th May 2025 at 1400 hrs at Lambley Primary School, Catfoot Lane, Lambley, Nottinghamshire

Stoke Bardolph Surgery – Tuesday 17th June 2025 at 1400 hrs at Stoke Bardolph Community Centre, Stoke Lane, Stoke Bardolph, Nottinghamshire

There are no particular crime patterns or trends that are of a concern. If you see something concerning, please report to 101 in a non emergency, or 999 if a crime is taking place.

I would continue to encourage residents to sign up to the Notts Alerts scheme (www.nottsalerts.co.uk). We are committed to better understanding local concerns, and we value the two way communication. It's also a great opportunity to have your say on policing where you live.

FROM A CONCERNED LAMBLEY RESIDENT

Recently I was out walking in the village and almost hit by a pavement cyclist. This occurred on a narrow pavement and the person concerned could, if I had not been able to avoid a collision, injured or seriously hurt. For that matter, I might have been hurt myself. This is just the latest in a number of related incidents.

Over the past two years, illegal pavement cycling in Lambley as elsewhere, has been a growing problem. It is being done on narrow pavements, bends, corners and in a manner that is dangerous and reckless, putting pedestrians and cyclists themselves at risk. I and others I know have seen groups of four or five people cycling on the pavement in the village, sometimes in families with adults. They are often young people at school, but worse still, are sometimes mature adults with, one assumes, full knowledge of the law and the rules of the road. They are choosing to disregard these.

For the purpose of clarification, pavement cycling is illegal. It is against the Highways Act Section 72 and Roads (Scotland) Act Section 129. Rule 64 of the Highway Code states:- "You MUST NOT cycle on a pavement." Anyone who drives a car will be aware of this.

Many elderly people live in the area, they may be partially sighted or hard of hearing. If no action is taken, it is only a matter of time before someone is seriously injured or even killed. This is not just a nuisance, it is a serious road safety problem that needs to be addressed.

Almost without exception these people if challenged, will become aggressive and try to intimidate pedestrians.

Pavement cyclists will argue that roads are not safe for cyclists, that there are not enough cycle tracks, that they are only trying to keep themselves safe and that the problem is caused by motorists. Pedestrians should not accept these arguments, since as the most vulnerable road users it is not their responsibility to protect cyclists. The safest way to use the road if you do not feel comfortable cycling is to walk on the pavement. This has become out of control and will only get worse if nothing is done.

We want everyone to feel safe on the streets. No-one wants anyone to be at risk or to be hurt. But pavement cycling is not the answer and pedestrians should not feel intimidated by pavement cyclists into feeling obliged to share the pavement. Our local council should send a clear message that pavement cycling is not acceptable and that pedestrians should not feel they have to put up with it.

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Protect your online accounts from hackers and enable 2SV: Action Fraud issue new warning about social media and email account hacking as new data is revealed. This year Action Fraud and Meta are encouraging the public to protect their social media and email accounts as data shows there were more than 35,000 reports made last year.

Data shows there was a rise of social media and email account hacking reported in 2024, with a total of 35,434 reports made to Action Fraud, compared to 22,530 reports made in 2023.

Action Fraud, the national fraud and cybercrime reporting service, has launched a campaign, supported by Meta, to encourage people to take an extra step of online protection by enabling 2-Step Verification for each online account they have. The warning comes as reporting shows nearly £1 million was lost to hackers last year. The most common motives for social media hacking were either investment fraud, ticket fraud or theft of the targeted account, reporting insights revealed.

Adam Mercer, Deputy Director of Action Fraud, said:

"As social media and email account hacking remains the most reported cybercrime

this year, this Action Fraud compaign modes a critical issue for every one who has

this year, this Action Fraud campaign marks a critical issue for everyone who has online accounts. That's why we're raising awareness of the ways people can protect themselves online.

"Follow Stop! Think Fraud advice and protect yourself online: enable 2-Step Verification on each online account you have – this will help prove your identity and stop fraudsters trying to steal or access your valuable information. LAMBLEY PARISH COUNCIL – WHAT IS HAPPENING AT THE MOMENT

Battery Energy Storage Site Planning Application

By the time we go to print on the magazine, we will know whether or not the above application has been passed by the Planning Committee. Hundreds of letters of objection have been sent to Gedling Borough Council from local residents. Despite this however, the Planning Officer has recommended this for approval in their report. The application will go before the planning committee on 26th March at 6pm at the Civic Centre.

Precept and Budget for 2025/6

The Parish Council has completed its budget forecasts for the 2025/26 year. A total spend of £36,901 for the year is required. Our projected income for the year from Cemetery fees, Lengthsman Scheme and the like provides for £11,750 before the Parish Precept. The Precept is the amount which each household pays to the Parish Council within its Council Tax. The required spend less the income leaves a shortfall for the year to be raised through the precept of £25,151.

For the 2024/25 year each household (based on a band D) paid £37.01 within its council tax to the Parish Council for the year. After careful consideration it was agreed by the Parish Councillors that we should increase the precept paid from its current level of £37.01 per annum, to £39.79, an increase of £2.78 per equivalent household (7.5%). Based on the number of households in the village this will raise £20,116.07 towards the Parish Council budget. The balance needed for the year (required spend after projected income of £25,151) will mean that there is still a shortfall of £5,034,93 however the Parish Councillors agreed that this should be met from our Reserves which are currently c£17K.

Unlike larger councils, Parish Councils are not restricted by how much they can increase Council Tax, however unlike many other local Parish Councils, we could not justify a larger increase as we appreciate the cost of living has risen sharply for everyone.

We carefully monitor our expenditure to make every penny count, and will continue to do so since it is your money we are spending. We should still have around £12K in reserves after meeting the shortfall for emergencies and unexpected spend. We are fortunate that there are various fund raising events throughout the year, which help to support village projects, and that as a result of these, we have some reserves.

All Change - Resignation & Vacancy

It has been an honour to be Chair of the Parish Council and to work with the amazing team and community we have here in Lambley for approximately 10 years, however after careful consideration I am resigning from the Parish Council.

I feel privileged to have been offered the role of Regional Chair for the Federation of Small Business, a volunteer role which will be demanding in terms of time to do it justice, hence my resignation from the Parish Council. The role will commence on 1st April. There are over 5.5million small businesses in the UK, accounting for 99% of all businesses and many of them are reporting a perfect storm in terms of trading conditions. It will be an honour to listen and help give a voice to shape government policy, to those businesses based in the East Midlands in the current challenging and complex landscape.

I may no longer be a Parish Councillor, however Lambley is in my blood, and I'm moving back into the village very shortly. If you see me out, please say hello or give me a wave!

My resignation means that there will now be a full voting role as a Parish Councillor available. If you are community minded and would like to apply for this volunteer (unpaid) position, please email clerk@lambleyparishcouncil.org.uk providing a contact telephone number.

Elections for Chair/Vice Chair etc take place within the Parish Council calendar at the April Meeting. Until that time Lawrence Milbourn will holding the reigns (thanks Lawrence).



REED POND RAMBLINGS



From the Lambley Reed Pond Group

Welcome to the April Edition of Reed Pond Ramblings

This month we are focusing on "Toads on Roads" with <u>Froglife</u> which has been running for over twenty years. The Reed Pond Committee have officially registered the Park Lane crossing from the Cemetery Car Park with <u>Froglife</u>, a national amphibian related charity.

This allows for the County Council to place Toad Crossing signs at the side of the road, making motorists aware and to reduce their speed. We are hopeful that creating awareness, will have a positive impact on the number of frogs and toads reaching the Reed Pond and may also open funding opportunities to create additional wetland habitats in the Reserve.



Within the Reed Pond you are most likely to see the Common Frog or Common Toad. Although there are two species of toad in the UK, the Common Toad and Natterjack Toad. Unlike frogs they are sensitive to the changes in temperature and usually emerge on warmer nights in April from their hibernation. The Common Toads often migrate to the same breeding ponds year after year, so it is important to protect the "migratory crossings". They make their way to Reed Pond from the nearby fields and gardens as toads need the deeper water to lay their eggs. The eggs are laid in strings on rushes and reeds.



We are always looking for volunteers to help aid the toads to reach the destination in the Nature Reserve and do this by catching them before they reach Park Lane or the Cemetery car park. If you wish to help all you will need is a bucket, a powerful torch and most importantly a good pair of gloves. A small child's fishing net is ideal too. We will provide the high visibility tabards.

Please contact Ian Kassell on 07964 297940 (the toad man of Lambley) who is co-ordinator for these patrols.



We are also compiling a census of frog and toad populations in and around the village. Ian would like to hear from you if you have observed frogs/newts or toads in your own garden or garden ponds. If you have any evidence of activity, frog or toad spawn with dates etc. Ian will then be able to collate the information and it can potentially use for future funding applications.



What else is Happening in the Reed Pond!

As part of the responses to the Reed Pond Questionnaire we are looking to install **FOUR information boards** around the Reed Pond Reserve, locating them next to the benches and the Community Orchard. The information boards will share information on what species of plants, mammals, birds, insects and amphibians can be observed in the Nature Reserve along with providing information about the Orchard Trees and the benefits they have on enhancing the biodiversity of wildlife within the Reserve.

We are hoping to engage further with the local Primary and Nursery schools so that the boards can form an educational aspect to their curriculum and create a nature walk for children within the reserve.



The boards will look similar the that pictured and the same size as the one currently in situ as you enter the reserve from Park Lane. Being made from recycled material it is also in keeping with our commitment to minimising our carbon footprint.



We have received **TWO** sponsors/dedications for the information boards already and we are looking for a **further TWO before we can place the order.** The price is £402 including VAT and includes the artwork for the board and your business logo or a memoriam or dedication to a friend/family member.



175 g S R Flour





Melt 50 g butter and mix in muscavado sugar. Stir in the fruit. Beat the remaining butter and sugar and add lemon zest and beaten egg. Sift & fold in the flour together with lemon juice.

Grease 1.2L basin

Put half fruit in bottom of basin then add half mix then fruit and rest of mix.

Cover with greaseproof and foil and steam 1½½ hours.



- 1. April is an ideal time to plant pot-grown fruit trees and bushes.
- Sow seeds outdoors for beetroot, carrots, Swiss chard, summer cauliflower, Kohl rabi, lettuce, leeks, raddish, turnips, spring and pickling onions, peas and perpetual spinach in well prepared soil.
- 3. Sow seeds indoors of marrows, courgettes, pumpkins and squash. Also sweet peppers, tomatoes, cucumbers, celery, aubergines, celeriac and globe artichokes.
- 4. In very mild areas sow dwarf French beans and sweetcorn outside under cloches at the end of April. In cooler areas wait until May.
- 5. Sow seed beds of brassicas to provide transplants of cabbages cauliflowers and sprouting broccoli.
- 6. Transplant broad beans grown in pots.
- 7. Plant onions, shallots and garlic sets.
- 8. Pot up tomato seedlings when they develop true leaves above the more rounded seed leaves.
