Lambley Nature 2025: August Wildlife Tips

- · Water is vital to humans and your garden eco system. You could add water to your spaces in a variety of creative ways! Birdbaths are great but also think about adding ground level sources for other creatures.
 - · Something for the children to build in their holidays and help nature at the same time.
 - · (Make your own mini version of Reed Pond). The Natural History Museum website have instructions on creating this.
- · Create a wildlife haven by reducing your mowing! You could reduce the number of cuts, leave some areas uncut or just cut some pathways. Leaving different grasses and plants can be beneficial for creating a species-rich garden. Beetles, spiders, sawflies, moths, butterflies, bees, grasshoppers, frogs, toads, bats, hedgehogs, blackbirds, robins (and lots more!) are some of the amazing species you might see, if you leave areas of your garden uncut!
- Be extra careful if you are cutting and strimming large numbers of young frogs and toads are killed at this time of the year by these – before you strim use a rake to see if anything is in the grass.
- · Don't use any chemicals on your garden. They can kill indiscriminately and affect the whole food chain. If you encourage lots of species, nature usually finds its own balance
- (you will find house sparrows will remove large numbers of greenfly from your roses without resorting to sprays which kill beneficial insects).

This Year has been so dry that songbirds like blackbirds and song thrushes cannot find their usual slugs, snails or worms – try soaking a black tarpaulin or sheet at night, place it on your lawn overnight – remove the next day early in the morning and you will provide a feast for hungry birds to feed their young.

· Nurture the environment and create a space for nature in your garden. You could also join a local / national nature-orientated group or maybe start your own, if you're eager!

Welcome to the August edition of the Reed Pond Ramblings.

Following the hugely successful quiz night held at the Lambley Village Hall we are delighted to confirm that the total raised was £1840. Thank you to all the teams who took part and all those that supported the event.

The money raised will go towards improvements within the Nature Reserve that will create further diversity of plant species. We are looking at completing work to the remaining hedgerows and boundaries.



Hedgerows are an important part of the reserve and provide a safe habitat for nesting birds and provide a food source for a variety of insects and other animals. We need to maintain the boundaries to ensure the safety of livestock when they are on the reserve also.





The money from the quiz will be used to erect more robust deer proof fencing around the fruit trees within the Community Orchard. We need to protect the young trees over the next few years so that the orchard can flourish.

The group have been working extremely hard over the last few months on Information Boards that will be placed around the reserve adjacent to the benches this year. We are pleased to announce that we have received donations for all FOUR of the boards and wish to thank all the donors. The boards will contain information about the different habitats within the Reed Pond Nature Reserve and photographs of some of the plants, insects, birds and animals that live within or visit the reserve. We are hoping that visitors will find these interesting and informative.

In July, we visited the Rolls-Royce Hucknall Flight Test Museum, an exciting new museum, located on the former historic Hucknall Airfield site in Nottinghamshire. We started with an introductory presentation, followed by a guided tour round the museum looking at test engines from the site, the John Housley model collection, archive documents with original films and photographs telling the unique history of Rolls-Royce flight and ground testing from 1934 to Test Facilities' final closure in the 1990's.

We return to evening meetings for our next event on Monday Sep 22 at 7.30pm. Ann Featherstone will give a talk entitled 'Mashed potato sandwiches and bottle top tinsel'. This will be a fascinating look at homemaking, parenting and cooking in times of austerity as shown by Rose Buckner, who wrote about it in her book and columns for the Sunday People newspaper.

A few years ago, Jeremy Lodge wrote an excellent book on Lowdham Grange Borstal and is now writing a new book for the centenary of its opening. So, if anyone has any memories, experiences or photographs of the Borstal or the local attitudes to the 'lads', please let us know so we can pass them on.

Jeremy has also seen some references to an air attack in August 1942 when incendiary bombs fell on the Ploughman's Wood area. Does anyone have any memories or knowledge of this incident?

2. Visit Free Museums and Attractions

Nottinghamshire has several museums and historic sites that are free or very low cost, with plenty to keep curious kids engaged.

Nottingham Contemporary Art Gallery

Offers free family workshops and creative spaces. Check their website for school holiday activities.

National Justice Museum (Nottingham)

Entry for children is free with a paying adult—and it's a fun and interactive way to explore history. Watch for special summer events.

Bilsthorpe Heritage Museum (Bilsthorpe)

A small, local mining museum with free entry - great for an afternoon visit.

Green's Windmill & Science Centre (Sneinton)

Free entry! Kids can learn about wind power and bake their own mini loaves during family baking days.

3. Stay Creative at Home

Some of the best summer days happen right at home. Here are a few ideas that are easy to set up:

Back garden "beach day": Add a paddling pool, sand, and ice lollies.

Obstacle course challenge: Indoors or outside using cones, cushions, and toys.

DIY cinema night: Popcorn, curtains drawn, and a family-friendly film.

Pro tip: Wilko, The Works, and Poundland in Nottingham often have £1 craft packs and summer activity books.

4. Join the Nottinghamshire Summer Reading Challenge

Rufford Abbey Country Park (Ollerton)

Parking is just a few pounds, and there's woodland walks, gardens, and a fantastic adventure playground.

6. Look Out for Free Local Events

Nottinghamshire councils and community groups often run free or low-cost events for children during the holidays.

Look out for:

Nottingham Beach (Old Market Square)

The city centre transforms into a summer beach, complete with sand and water play. Entry is free - just pay for rides or extras if you want to.

Free family fun days at Victoria Embankment and Forest Recreation Ground Often include live music, crafts, face painting, and more.

Sherwood Forest Visitor Centre (Edwinstowe)

Home of Robin Hood! Entry is free (just pay for parking). Enjoy forest trails, sculptures, and free storytelling sessions.

Tip: Follow local Facebook groups like Nottinghamshire What's On for Families or Notts Kids for real-time updates on events.

7. Create a Weekly Adventure Plan

To keep things fun and balanced, pick one or two days each week for "mini adventures" and mix them with relaxed days at home e.g.

Monday – Craft day at home

Wednesday – Park and picnic

Friday – Free museum or story time session

Lambley Playground Interest Group - Consultation & Funding Update

We are delighted to share the latest news from the Lambley Playground Interest Group, as we continue working towards the revitalisation of our village play park.

Consultation with Lambley Primary School

We have now completed our consultation with the children of Lambley Primary School—what a joy it was to speak with all 182 pupils! Their enthusiasm and imagination were truly inspiring, and we have received a fantastic range of ideas and themes for the new play park.

One of the more popular suggestions, which came up several times, was to include a dog park—a lovely reminder of how much the children value outdoor space for everyone, including their four-legged friends.

A special thank you to Mrs. Shardlow and Year 2, who took the consultation one step further by setting a creative task for the children to design their perfect play park.

We would also like to extend our heartfelt thanks to Amy Woodcock, Alicia Fleur, Jane Proctor and Racheal Smith for their invaluable help and support in making this consultation a great success.

The general consultation is still live, please scan the QR code and be included.

Funding & Next Steps

Now that we have gathered a clear and community-driven vision for the future of the park, we're turning our attention to the next key challenge: funding.

We are pleased to share that Cllr Jody Stoll is supporting the project by earmarking potential funding through the Local Communities Fund, which is expected to become available soon. We're also grateful to Cllr Andy Mead, who remains a great advocate for our group and is helping identify additional funding streams.

We plan to apply to the Landfill Communities Fund, which recently supported the redevelopment of Jackie Bells Fields in Netherfield. With strong community backing and a compelling vision, we are optimistic about securing the support needed to move forward.

A Glimpse into the Past

As part of our efforts, we have also been looking into the park's history. A local resident recently contacted us to ask about the bronze plaque commemorating King George V which once marked our playing field as a King George V Memorial field. It was originally attached to one of the stone columns at the Catfoot Lane entrance; when the column was damaged the plaque was in the school but now appears to be missing.

We have contacted the Lambley Historical Society, who have kindly offered to search through archived Parish Council minutes to help us trace its history. This enquiry reminds us that the field holds not only future promise but also significant heritage—dating back to early plans that were postponed due to the Second World War.

FOR some time past the Notts. Education with the Nottingham Playing Fields Association with regard to the acquisition of some land adjoining the Lambley Council School for playing field purposes. The area of the land is four acres in extent, and the Committee are of opinion that it would be advisable for the County Council and the Playing Fields Association to make two separate purchases of two acres each and that arrangements could be made in the future for the joint use of this land by the schoolchildren and as a playing field for the parish. The District Valuer has accordingly been asked to negotiate for the purchase of the two acres of land adjoining the school.

The Lambley Playground Interest Group met on the 16th of July to discuss progress. The groups current focus is now on securing funding to improve and develop the playground.

Josephine Violet Plumb (of Lambley) 1938 - 2024

By the time this short memorial goes to print, we as a family will have commemorated the first year of Jo Plumb's passing. Jo was a senior citizen and elder of the Lambley Village community, having lived for over 55 years in her modest former council house. Jo moved to Lambley with her local lad husband Gerald. Gerald was a nurseryman and a market gardener. They raised their two children in Lambley and later helped to raise their eldest grandson.

More senior members of the village community may remember that Jo worked as a cleaner at various homes and addresses in the village and also at the local public house, The Nags Head, now The Lambley.

Younger people may remember her as the village Lollipop Lady, escorting young children safely across the road to school.

Jo lived a quiet and modest life in Lambley as a wife, mother and grandma to several grandchildren and later great grandma to the latest members of her family. Jo loved to help cultivate her garden and in her younger years would help the farming community to gather in their harvest.

Andy Warhol tells us that we all get 15 minutes of fame, Jo's was in the 1980's, whilst visiting the village hairdressing salon on Main Street, there was a flash flood with the Lambley Dumble's dyke being completely overwhelmed, the rain water flooded the village and a very wet Jo and other customers at the salon had to be rescued in a dinghy by the Fire Brigade. Rumour at the time said you could hear Jo's laughter up at Wicket Wood. She found the hunky firemen quite a distraction.

Years passed and Jo's mobility lessened and she became more dependent on her wheelchair, but her spirit of adventure didn't diminish. Jo really looked forward to her summer holidays, car rambles in the Derbyshire Peak District, Edinburgh, Liverpool and Meadowhall Shopping Centre, all undertaken with gusto and vigour. Jo loved to explore new places and took to flying from East Midlands Airport in her stride, all of this from aged 70+.

Jo visited Spain, Portugal, Gibraltar, Lanzarote, Majorca, Cyprus, Rhodes and Turkey to name just some of her experiences.

Then sadly and quietly Jo passed away in her middle 80's and as in her life, she went with the minimum amount of fuss, not wanting to be a burden on her loving family.

Jo now rests with her beloved husband Gerald at the quiet and tranquil Lambley Cemetery, under the epitaph "We fell asleep and here we lie, under a broad and starry sky."

Miss you mum, you lived your life to the best of your ability, modestly and quietly. Sleep tight.



July began with our annual summer trip, this time to Stratford on Avon. We had a really lovely day with fabulous weather and the opportunity for some good retail therapy in addition to a boat trip on the river. One group of ladies even did a successful treasure hunt whilst others enjoyed a leisurely lunch and sightseeing in the beautiful weather.

Our July speakers were Linda and Stephen from Moo Haven horse rescue charity. The charity began by accident after Linda was asked if she would take in an abandoned pony. At the time they had a small yard in Sandiacre but, as more neglected horses began to turn up, they outgrew their premises and heard of an abandoned and neglected equestrian facility with 22 acres in West Bridgford which was owned by the council. After much work to make it suitable they moved in and in 2013 became a registered charity.

We were surprised to discover how many hoops have to be jumped through before charity status can be achieved and much of the required finance was generated by local fund raising. To date they have helped some 200 horses and donkeys in addition to other random animals they have been asked to help. Many of the horses have been neglected or ill-treated but after careful care and rehabilitation have gone on to compete successfully at county level.

Rescue Horses are never sold and although there is an adoption fee the charity always retains ownership and gets regular updates from adopters to check on welfare.

Costs run at about £6000 per month and there is only one paid member of staff with the remainder being volunteers or on work experience. They do a lot of work with Special Educational Needs children and children excluded from mainstream education because of behavioural issues.

It was clear that Linda and Stephen are passionate about what they do and it was moving to hear the sad stories of some of the rescues not all of whom survived.

Our next meeting is Monday 11th August when we will be having a picnic and outdoor games weather permitting starting at 7pm

We are a friendly group of women who would love to welcome new members with new ideas

LAMBLEY PARISH COUNCIL – WHAT IS HAPPENING AT THE MOMENT

At the July meeting of the Parish Council, we had a report presented to us by Amy and Luke from the newly established playground Group. They demonstrated their enthusiasm and commitment while explaining to us their plans to raise funds for the renovation of the playground.

County Councillor Jody Stoll explained to us the possible outcomes of the Government reorganisation of local government with the introduction of Unitary Authorities. The Parish Council voiced opposition to one of the possibilities, the merger of Gedling Borough with Nottingham City and others to form a Greater Nottingham Unitary Authority. We feel that our rural community fits better with the small towns and villages of North Nottinghamshire. The final decisions will be made by the Deputy Prime Minister.

District Councillor Helen Greensmith explained to us the timetable for the production of a new Gedling Local Development Plan. The initial proposal includes the development of three major areas attached to the village and proposes the building of over 370 homes. We are opposed to this and are particularly concerned that the minimal infrastructure that we have at present, would be totally overwhelmed by such massive development. Our sewage system struggles to service our present population. We have no shops, medical or dental facilities. We have a shared village hall and a primary school that is bursting at the seams. We will be making representations about these proposals. Please look at these proposals yourselves at https://gedling.inconsult.uk/GLDPIO and pass your opinions to the authority.

We have received many flood warnings over the last couple of weeks, none of which actually materialised. It seems that the Environment Agency is erring on the safe side with its warnings.

There is, of course, the danger that the public will think that the EA is crying "wolf" and will ignore future warnings. Please be assured that the Lambley Flood Warden Team will remain alert to these warnings and will respond when the need arises.

As reported previously, a lot of maintenance work has been carried out in the cemetery. In clearing the boundary bushes, brick and concrete rubble has been exposed. A working group is being set up to clear this away. Please look out for calls to volunteer to help in this important task. You may be aware that the Parish Council does not meet in August so the next meeting will be on 15th September 2025. We wish you all a pleasant summer.



KEY LIME PIE

Ingredients

300g oatmeal biscuits 110 g butter melted

1 x 397 g condensed milk
3 medium egg yolks
Finely grated zest and juice of 4 limes
300 ml double cream
1 tbsp icing sugar
Extra lime zest to decorate

Method

Heat the oven to 160C/Fan 140C/Gas3

Whizz or crush the oatmeal biscuits until crumbed and add to melted butter then press into the base and up the sides of a loose bottomed 22 cm tin. Bake in the oven for 10 minutes then remove and let cool.

Put the 3 medium egg yolks into a large bowl and whisk for one minute with electric beaters.

Add the can of condensed milk and whisk for 3 minutes. Add the finely grated lime zest and juice and whisk for a further 3 minutes. Pour the filling into the cooled base and place in the oven for 15 minutes. Remove and cool. To Decorate whip the cream and icing sugar and put on top and spinkle with lime zest. Remove from tin onto a serving place and enjoy.

- 9. Keep ponds and water features topped up. Make sure there is water in the bird baths.
- 10. Improve soil with green manures.
