Unbelievably half of the £15000 required has been raised/donated.

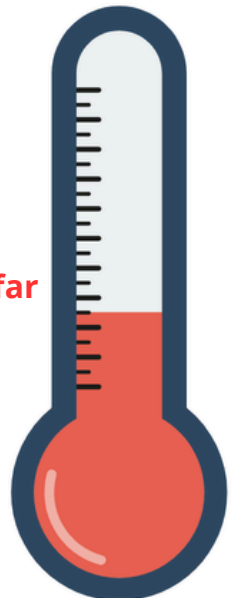
£5000 from the Bonfire proceeds

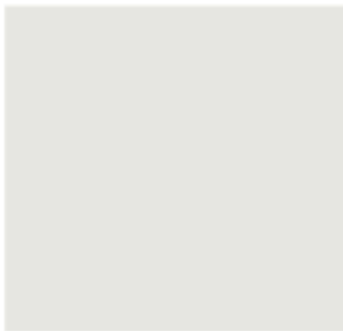

Warning over doorstep delivery thefts

We are urging online Christmas shoppers to be vigilant and take steps to reduce their chances of falling victim to doorstep parcel thieves.

With the Christmas countdown now in full swing, many people are ordering items online and having them delivered to their homes - which makes this a prime time for opportunistic theft.

If delivered to your home and left unattended, parcels can be easily stolen by doorstep thieves.

In previous years, around this time of year, we have received reports involving the theft of parcels, containing hundreds of pounds worth of goods, left outside people's homes.

With this in mind, we are encouraging everyone to take appropriate action when ordering items online, ensuring they are protected to help prevent parcel theft.



Here are some things you could do to reduce the risk of parcel theft:

- Track your parcel to ensure you or someone else is at home for the delivery
- Install a video doorbell; this can be connected to your mobile so you are notified immediately of any delivery, and is easier to install than a full CCTV system

- Install a security light and/or CCTV
- Arrange for your parcel to be delivered to a trusted neighbour, or other family members who will be at home
- Use an off-site locker service for frequent deliveries, or for expensive items; these parcel boxes are more likely to be in busy, safer locations - such as supermarkets - rather than secluded areas which could be targeted by thieves

If you have ordered a delivery which has not arrived, first contact the delivery company and sender.

If you think a parcel has been stolen or notice anyone acting suspicious, you can make a report online or by calling 101.

Alternatively, you can call Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111.

LAMBLEY PARISH COUNCIL – WHAT IS HAPPENING AT THE MOMENT

The Parish Council met on the 8th December, a week earlier than usual at the request of the WI, who wanted to hold their Christmas party on the 15th.

We were pleased to be joined by our District Councillor, Helen Greensmith and our County Councillor, Jody Stoll. We were also joined by Bonnie Bramwell, the Chair of the Reed Pond Committee.

Bonnie was able to tell us about the recent work done on the Reed Pond site and about their plans for the coming year. We expressed our thanks to the committee for their hard work and confirmed our support for their plans. You will be able to read their report elsewhere in this edition.

Cllrs Greensmith and Stoll explained about the differing views of their Councils about the future of the new unitary authorities planned by the government.

We were delighted with the Christmas Lights switch-on on the 1st December but were disappointed with the number of villagers who turned out to support us. The tree is looking particularly fine. Next year, we are going to have to spend at least £15,000 to provide power columns for our lights. Generous donations mean that we have already reached the half-way point in our fundraising. Thank you to those who have supported us.

The memory tree, in memory of Mike Morris, has been erected in the Reed Pond Reserve. You are able to purchase a leaf to commemorate a loved one. Details below.

The main doors to the Village Hall are reaching the end of their useful life and the Parish Council has agreed to help the Village Hall Committee fund their replacement. Quotes are being obtained for this. There are regulations for doors into public buildings that mean this is not as straightforward and inexpensive as it might at first sight seem.

Although the planning application for the battery energy storage scheme just off Spring Lane was agreed by GBC earlier this year, more facts have come to light about potential safety issues and we are discussing this with GBC. If there are any future developments, rest assured that we will inform you as soon as we are able.

As I write, we are not sure when you will receive this edition of Lambley Life. If you get this later than usual, we apologise but even printers have a Christmas Break!

We hope you have had a very happy Christmas and we look forward to another successful New Year.

APPLE AND CINNAMON CAKE

Ingredients

225g (8 oz)	Self Raising Flour
1 tsp	Baking Powder
225 g (8 oz)	Caster Sugar
2 large	Eggs
1 tsp	Almond Extract
150g (5 oz)	Butter (melted, plus extra for greasing)
350g (12 oz)	Cooking apples, peeled, cored and sliced (225g (8oz) prepared weight)
25g (1oz)	Flaked Almonds



Method

Preheat the oven to 160C/140C Fan/Gas 3. Grease the base of a 20cm (8in) deep loose-bottomed cake tin and line with non-stick baking paper.

Measure the flour, baking powder and sugar into a bowl. Stir in the eggs, almond extract and butter. Beat well with an electric hand whisk until smooth.

Spoon half the mixture into the base of the prepared tin. Arrange the apple slices on top in a neat pattern - overlap the slices and pile them up slightly in the centre. Spoon over the remaining cake mixture, then level the surface.

Sprinkle the top of the cake with the flaked almonds and bake in the preheated oven for about 1½ hours, until pale golden brown and shrinking away from the sides of the tin. The centre of the cake may have dipped slightly, depending on the variety of apples used. Remove from the oven and release from the sides of the tin. Leave to cool in the tin for about 15 minutes.

Turn the cake onto a serving plate and serve whilst it is still warm.

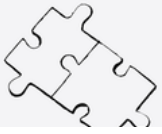

Jobs in the garden for December

1. Protect terracotta pots from cracking in freezing weather by bringing them indoors or wrapping in bubble polythene.
 2. Rake up accumulated fallen leaves in borders that could be harbouring slugs and other pests.
 3. Plant bare-root roses and other deciduous shrubs plus ornamental trees.
 4. Hang bird feeders near roses to attract hungry birds that will also pick off any overwintering pests.
 5. Cut stems of berried winter shrubs, seasonal flowers and evergreen leaves for festive decorations and wreaths.
 6. Prune climbing roses between now and February.
 7. Hard prune overgrown shrubs and hedges while they are dormant.
 8. Check stored bulbs and corms regularly for any signs of rot.
 9. Move plants in pots to sheltered spots if the conditions turn very cold.
 10. Pile straw or bracken around the base of tender shrubs or climbers to protect them from falling temperatures.
