Lambley Nature 2025: July Wildlife Tips

In this very dry Spring it is essential to give water to new plants and shrubs in the evenings or early mornings. Soak roots well at regular intervals.

If you have acid loving plants like blueberries you can leave tap water for 48 hrs and the harmful chemicals will mostly go. This trick can also be done if your pond is losing water.

Deadhead plants so that more flowers appear and provide nectar. At the end of summer stop dead heading, so that the seeds can be eaten by birds and mammals over autumn and winter. You could also collect seeds and store them in a cool, dry place for use next spring.

Think of creating an area where the grass will grow longer or better still create a small wildflower meadow area, many butterflies lay their eggs in tall grasses – you can also buy locally plug plants from Naturescape in Nottinghamshire.

Please also remember to leave water out in a shallow bird bath. Change it daily and clean the bath each week, to avoid midge and mosquitos laying eggs in it.

Leave unmown areas, or just keep a pathway mown through your meadow. The insects should flourish! Leave the blades higher if you feel the need for the lawn- this reducing the grasses burning. Try not to cut hedges because there will still be birds nesting in them this month and into early August. Load the merlin bird application on your phone to see the variety of birdlife you have in your garden and those passing overhead.

Purchase a bat detector – we are entering prime bat activity months when the weather cools down – bats don't like intense heat and stop flying.

This could become our hottest Summer on record in total contrast to 2024.

You may have noticed that there are very few pollinators around your plants, this Year once again has been bad news for all insects, bees and moths. The latest Government research is showing forever chemicals in our water courses and what we are drinking, this is another problem for not us but our wildlife. As insect numbers are so low, birds will be grateful if you feed them with mealworms (live ones preferably) or if dried soak these well prior to feeding.

Think about installing a swift box on your property under the eaves they are looking for nest sites in our village – welcome your home to these aerial acrobats, rather than excluding them - they can be obtained from peak boxes at a reasonable price in Derbyshire. Swifts will take midges, wasps and hornets on the wing so are true garden friendly birds.

Finally as always, enjoy your garden! See how many different plants, insects, bugs, birds and mammals your space can support. What about taking part in the Big Butterfly Count, run by Butterfly Conservation? Visit their website for more info.





Snippets from the LHS Archives

This is the next in a series of photographs and articles collected by the LHS featuring Lambley in the past. We have many photographs in our collection, but if you have any recollections of people, places or events from Lambley we would love to see them. We can scan and return any photos and as much information as possible is always useful.

Unfortunately, the photograph in last month's magazine was inadvertently cropped during publication, so it is being shown again in full. This photo shows the Lambley cricket team in 1975 and thanks to Phil Greaves for naming the players and for his reminiscences.

"Home matches were played at the School Field, where a level cricket square had been laid towards the far end. The pavilion stood in the bottom corner near to the current bonfire site. Phil first played for Lambley CC in late summer 1968, shortly after moving into the village with wife Linda. At that time the team mainly comprised village men in their late-30s and 40s, who retired from the game during the next 4-5 years. Of those in the picture only Selby, Miller, Greaves and the Nicholson brothers were resident in Lambley. Other village-resident players on the books at the time were David Little, Brian Holland, and teenagers Mark Wortley and John Isbell. We had to rely on friends and work colleagues from outside Lambley to keep the Club going. It had become increasingly difficult to raise a team and we reluctantly decided to call it a day at the end of the 1976 season."

UPDATE FROM NOTTINGHAMSHIRE POLICE

It is a pleasure to be able to continue to contribute towards the Lambley Life Magazine and provide you an update on Lambley and the surrounding areas. Unfortunately, speeding remains a concern and is a local priority for us. Gedling Safer Neighbourhoods Team (SNT) continue to conduct monthly speeding operations in various areas across the divisional area. We aim to be intelligence led and officers will identify suitable locations based on intelligence reports from the public and whilst liaising with local Councillors.

We continue to support the Community Safety Watch (CSW) scheme and Cllr Gregory has a strong contingent of volunteers which also supports our police enforcement initiatives. PCSO Trevor Parkinson (trevor.parkinson@notts.police.uk) has recently delivered a training session at Richard Heron Centre for the Community Road Safety (CRS) alongside Cllr Andrew Ellwood. As a result, 3 new members of the public volunteered their services which is fantastic.

The team have held a number of monthly Beat surgeries in the last quarterly period across the area and we continue to listen to your issues and concerns. Gedling SNT cover Lambley, Burton Joyce and Stoke Bardolph and we aim to have one Beat Surgery in each of the main areas. We will continue to run Beat Surgery once a month in all three areas on a revolving basis. This is to ensure we the public have fair access to the police and equally importantly, we understand the different concerns our communities face. I am pleased to report the following Beat Surgeries will take place over the next three months:-

- Burton Joyce Surgery Wednesday 23rd July 2025at 1400 hrs at Burton Joyce Library, Burton Joyce, Nottinghamshire
 - Lambley Beat Surgery Monday 18th August 2025 at 1400 hrs at Lambley Primary School, Catfoot Lane, Lambley, Nottinghamshire
- Stoke Bardolph Surgery Tuesday 23rd September 2025 at 1400 hrs at Stoke Bardolph Community Centre, Stoke Lane, Stoke Bardolph, Nottinghamshire

NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Making public transport safer in Nottinghamshire.

Partners are joining forces to make public transport even safer as part of a pioneering new pilot scheme in Nottinghamshire.

Operation Safenet will see closer collaboration and information sharing between police and Nottingham's tram operator to prevent crime, analyse trends and come up with solutions that keep passengers safe on and around the 20-mile tram network.

Police and Crime Commissioner (PCC) Gary Godden is bringing together Nottinghamshire Police and Nottingham Express Transit (NET) for the collaborative project, as part of his vision to keep people safe, especially women and girls.

Passengers will also benefit from enhanced support, monitoring and evidence gathering from dozens of existing 'help points' at tram stops and CCTV cameras across the tram system.

If successful, the 12-month pilot scheme could be extended or rolled out to other forms of public transport across Nottinghamshire.

PCC Godden said: "Nottingham is a great city and Operation Safenet is about making it even safer by bringing partners together to work more closely behind the scenes on things like evidence gathering, information sharing and crime prevention.

"It includes employing a researcher to analyse crime and antisocial behaviour patterns. This then allows existing front-line resources, such as officers from Neighbourhood Policing Teams, to take targeted and datadriven action to solve local problems and nip any issues in the bud. "Not only will this benefit the people of Nottinghamshire, it is also going to

support tram staff to stay safe as they carry out their jobs.

"We know that public transport is vital to the way people live their lives, particularly with the cost of living making personal travel more expensive. I want people to be safe in the knowledge that when they come to Nottingham for a night out, to work, or to visit, they will be safe on our public transport network."

The scheme will complement the ongoing work across the city and county to create safe spaces and ensure that someone in need of a temporary sanctuary can find a location near to them where they can access help.

In June Eva and Jean came to talk to us about bobbin lace making and its regional variations. They showed us examples of different laces and patterns on Vellum and the different lace making equipment used to make them.

Nottingham's history with lace stretches back centuries from a small settlement to a globally recognised centre for lace production and the Lace Market, the oldest part of Nottingham, became a hub for the industry in the 19th century particularly with the advent of mechanised lace making. While lace production has declined from its peak Nottingham's legacy as a lace making centre remains significant.

It was interesting to get an insight into the hardships associated with the lace industry with children as young as 5 or 6 years old expected to sit all day making lace and the harshness of the buyers if there were any mistakes or marks on the goods.

The ladies all then had the opportunity to try their hand at a bit of lace making which was enjoyed by everyone.





CREME CARAMEL

Ingredients

75 g (3 oz) granulated sugar 3 tablespoons water 3 eggs 25 g (1 oz) caster sugar 450 ml (3/4 pint) milk

½ teaspoon vanilla essence



Apologies for the picture - I nearly forgot to take one before it was gone!

Put the granulated sugar and water in a pan. Heat gently, stirring, until dissolved, then cook to a rich caramel without stirring - do not burn! Carefully add 1 teaspoon of boiling water and pour into a 90 ml (1½ pint souffle dish or mould.

Beat the eggs and caster sugar together. Heat the milk almost to boiling point and add to the eggs with the vanilla essence. Mix well. Strain into the souffle dish and place in a roasting pain containing 2.5 cvm (1 inch) water. Bake in a preheated cool oven (140 degreec C (275F Gas 1) for 1½ hours until set. Cool then turn out into a serving dish. (You can also make individual puds in ramekins).

- 1. Deadhead bedding plants and repeat flowering perennials to ensure continuous flowering.
- 2. Water tubs and new plants if dry dont forget to use grey water collected in the house.
- 3. Check clematis for signs of clematis wilt.
- 4. Pick courgettes before they become marrows!
- 5. Start picking tomatoes as they ripen, continue to remove side shoots and feed and water the plants.
- 6. Clear algae and blanket weed from ponds and keep them topped up.
- 7. Deadhead, feed and water for a longlasting show
- 8. Dont worry if your lawn goes brown as it will soon bounce back when we have rain
- 9. Harvest apricots, peaches and nectarines if you have them.
- 10. Cut back faded perennials and keep the borders tidy.
