#### **Lambley Village Show**

The Village Show took place on Saturday 6th September and was a great success. The total raised after expenses was a fabulous £4493.11 (including £1000 match funding from Barclays UK).

The monies will be used towards the cost of the nine leaky dams which have now been installed in the top Dumbles to help slow the flow of water into the village and help prevent flooding. The total cost of these was £5k so thanks to the Parish Council for agreeing to make up the difference.

We had a record number of entries this year in the show (based on recent years).

In total there were 407 entries!

It really was a wonderful family day out. The Show was opened by Kyle Robinson-Payne, Mayor of Gedling and Michael Payne MP came along too to support us. We had performances from Chloe Barrett-Reid who did two fantastic sets for us with a collection of Disney and 80s songs. Even though Chloe is a paid performer, she requested we put her fee towards the fundraising (so very generous). The Tuneless Choir - Burton Joyce also performed a wonderful collection of songs.

The fun dog show had some amazing entries with some really wonderful pooches (and some great owners too!). The Lambley WI once again were keeping everyone fed and watered all day and The Woodlark Inn supplied the bar. Bill Edwards was our first aider - thanks to him for giving his time and support and to Rob Green for supplying the bales used for seating.

This year the quality and volume of entries in the various competition classes was extremely high. Thank you to Tom Smith for giving his time to run the auction for us of the produce and the auction lots including Cricket Tickets from Nottinghamshire County Cricket Club and the Luxury Hamper of cosmetics and perfumes donated by L'Oréal Paris.

Thank you to our main sponsors Nottingham Care Village for their support and Reflex Labels Ltd (Ian Kendall) who print and design the brochures free of charge.



#### The Reed Pond Ramblings

From the Lambley Reed Pond Group

Welcome to the November Edition of the Reed Pond Ramblings. The Reed Pond Committee and Volunteers had a brilliant day on Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> October for our annual Reed Pond Rake-Up. The sheep provided by Tony and Val Chilman had done a tremendous job, and we would like to thank them for their support. After the field was cut by Andy Musson, the task of raking up the cuttings began. The event on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> October was cancelled due to bad weather. A lot of volunteers came to help, and we soon got on with the task at hand and completed the work the same day. A big thank you to all our volunteers Janet, Richard, Julian, Katja, Naomi, Tom, Max and Lindsey, Sofia, Harry and Darcie!

Also, a big thank you again to Tom Smith for providing his tractor and trailer on the day which helped so much moving the grass into piles around the reserve. These will create great habitats for animals such as hedgehogs, frogs, toads and over wintering insects.



Refreshments and cakes were provided by Judith and Naomi which were appreciated by all!









#### What's Happening on the Reed Pond Nature Reserve this Month!

On the 17<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> October will begin the start of our work funded by the Thriving in a Wilder Trent project. We are looking to manage and maintain the woodland area around the pond which will involve removing a few diseased trees along with reducing the number of trees that have self-set and become overcrowded. This will allow the remaining trees to have room to grow healthy and mature.

Thinning the trees will help create much needed light on the ground for nature flowering plants to grow and will also reduce the amount of leaf little falling into the pond. We have recently had an independent ecology survey completed on the nature reserve as a whole and the pond scored poorly. As a group we are also looking at applying for grants to enhance the pond and pond life, however this requires funding and organisation and will be something we will be working towards for Autumn of 2026/27.

In October/November we are going to be planting a diverse range of native plants both within the wooded area and close to the ponds edge to create a haven for insects and other pollinators, creating diversity and help encourage other species to thrive within the pond area. This will create a colourful attractive display of flowering plants throughout the year such as bluebells, foxglove, wood anemone, primrose and honeysuckle, marsh marigolds, purple



loosestrife, amphibious bistort and King cups.

The grant money from Thriving in a Wilder Trent project will also fund the removal in places of the reed bed which has started to take over both the pond and started to encroach into the grassland areas in front of the benches. This will create better views from the west bench into the pond, something that frequent users of the reserve have commented to the committee in the past. Annual work undertaken by committee member and volunteers unfortunately hasn't reduced the amount of reed growth.

Finally, the remaining funds we are looking to establish a meadow area to the right-hand side of the footpath as you got into the reserve from the Church Street pedestrian entrance.





#### **Lambley Nature: November Wildlife Tips**

- Create leaf piles for fungi, insects and small creatures to thrive in. They'll
  make a lovely leaf mould compost for you to use! Try not to throw away, or
  burn, anything toads and this year's froglets will hide within them.
- Planting bulbs like early flowering daffodils and crocus will provide Spring food for early queen bumble bees or insects!
- Bring your bee boxes to a safe dry place blue tits / great tits will try to eat the embryo bees in the canes.
- 4. Why not make a hedgehog house out of a wooden box with an open side, or piles of leaves and twigs left around the garden? Make sure that it is safe from badgers by incorporating a safe chamber within the box.
- 5. Keep bird baths topped up with fresh water and clean bird feeders regularly over winter. Despite the latest rains birds and animals are actively searching for water sources. You will also notice that the ground is "rock hard" still and birds cannot find worms or snails easily.
- Nestboxes can be put up, so that they can acclimatise for the following nesting season.
- Look at wildlife websites; for example, RSPB, Woodland Trust, Wildlife Trust etc. for more information on how to make bug hotels and bird boxes.
- 8. Enjoy the outdoors! What can you spot during the Winter months? Let's encourage every bit of wildlife that we can!
- Many of you will have Bonfires this Month please remember hedgehogs may be thinking of hibernating in these piles of timber for Winter – You can fence the bonfire off or better still build the bonfire soon before bonfire night. We also thank the Parish Council for having another silent fireworks night on 8<sup>th</sup> November.
- Lastly take a trip down to our village wildlife reserve "Reed Pond" and the woodland trust owned reserve located at Bonny Dols near the ravine.

#### NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Here is your guide to staying safe when using the internet from Neighbourhood Watch – stay safe online and in your home

#### **Protect your passwords**

Use a different password for each account and make them strong by combining random words with numbers and symbols. A password manager can help keep them safe and memorable.

#### Keep your devices secure

Install reliable internet security software (often called anti-virus) on your computers, tablets, and smartphones – and keep it switched on and updated. Protect your devices with a unique password or passcode.

#### **Update regularly**

Operating system, app and software updates often include essential security protection. Installing them when prompted helps keep your devices safe. Better still, set them to update automatically.

#### Pause and check who you're dealing with

Online messages, emails or phone calls aren't always from who they appear to be. Al can make fake messages seem even more convincing, so take a moment to confirm identities before sharing information, by contacting the person or organisation they claim to come from on the number you know to be correct.

#### Think before you click

Clicking on links and attachments in unexpected emails, texts or posts can lead to fraud, identity theft or other harms. If something feels unusual, take time to check it first.

#### Stay smart when using public Wi-Fi

Wi-Fi in cafés, hotels, and public spaces isn't always secure, or it could even be fraudulent. For private activities such as banking or shopping, use your mobile data, a personal dongle, or a VPN.

#### Choose safe ways to pay

Use secure payment methods such as credit cards or trusted services when shopping online. These give you stronger protection than a direct bank transfer, where you may lose your money in the event of fraud.

#### Report it!

If you come across fraud, scams, or abuse, report it to the appropriate authorities. Acting quickly can protect you and others.

#### Take care what you share

Be careful with the personal details you post online, such as your address or financial or other confidential information. Once shared, it can be hard to control who sees it.

#### **Check information and news**

Not all online information is trustworthy. Misinformation, disinformation, and Al-generated fake news can look very real.

Our speaker for October was Dawn Blundell from Sophisticake based in Woodhall Spa, who made the wedding cake for the King and Queen. Dawn is based in a small shop in Woodhall and has been baking cakes for over 40 years. She moved here from Poole, subsequently starting her business with her sister in law. Dawn is a larger than life character who introduced us to husband number 4 after telling us that she has made all her own wedding cakes!

Dawn's passion is sugar craft but she firmly believes that the cake should be as good as the decoration. She showed us some amazing creations she has made in her small bakery and she goes to a great deal of trouble to ensure whatever she makes has accurate detail be it machinery, flowers or animals. Dawn's son is a chef and caters for bespoke events at the royal palaces which is how she became involved in tendering to make the wedding cakes for the then Prince Charles. She was asked to make a sample of her fruit cake which is based on an old family recipe. Prince Charles loved it and Dawn went on to make cake to be sold in Highgrove. This all led to a call from Clarence House asking her to make the cake for the big day. The cake itself had to be large enough to be cut into 800-1000 slices in addition to making 2,500 slices to give away to worthy individuals.

All this involved 400lbs of dried fruit and 10080 eggs in addition to all other ingredients.so this was baking on a grand scale and a domestic oven was not going to suffice so Dawn pulled in a favour to borrow the commercial ovens of a bakery, all whilst being sworn to absolute secrecy! The main cake weighed over 17 stones and was assembled in Woodhall Spa Methodist church before being collected and taken to Clarence House with everyone holding their breath that it arrived in one piece.

It was all a great success and subsequently Dawn was asked to make a sugar craft cake topper for the late Queen's 80th birthday in addition to birthday cakes for Camilla's 60th and prince Charles 70th.

Dawn had received lovely personal thank you letters from both Charles and Camilla which was a touching tribute to her hard work.

In addition to this very interesting talk many of our members brought along their own wedding photos which were lovely to see and look at the different fashions. We will be decorating the bus shelter for Remembrance Day as we usually do and will be providing refreshments for the village bonfire. We are sincerely hoping we don't run out of food as quickly as we did last year which was a bit manic! Also in November we will be going along to Burleigh Christmas Fair so more of that next month.

# LAMBLEY PARISH COUNCIL – WHAT IS HAPPENING AT THE MOMENT

The Parish Council met on Monday 20 October. There were several absentees due to holidays and illness but we had enough attendees to make a quorum and good discussions. Cllr Jody Stoll also attended.

It was brought to our attention that the flood lights at the MUGA were malfunctioning and it was agreed that the school and Parish Council would go 50:50 on the repair.

Cllr Stoll said he had had some complaints from horse riders on Catfoot Lane about the speeding traffic and was asked if a "SLOW DOWN – HORSES" sign could be erected. Cllr Stoll said he had enquired and apparently unless the horses have to cross the road to reach a bridle path or similar it is not deemed necessary! If any horse riders have any complaints with regard to Catfoot Lane can they please submit a complaint – the more complaints received will help the case. There was nothing to report regarding flooding at the moment but it had been noted that the tankers had been around the village cleaning the drains.

We have managed to persuade Notts County Council to allow us to have six sets of Christmas lights on the trees this year. We usually have eight trees lit up but unfortunately the tree on the corner of Church Street, Park Lane and Main Street will be absent and another on Main Street. We have now got to fund the cost of installation of some columns that are isolated from the NCC columns. This has been a longstanding course for NCC to not to allow anything at all on any of their columns/lampposts but they are now enforcing the issue – not just with us but all over the county. We are applying for any funding that may help but if anyone would like to help with any fundraising or ideas please let us know. Once these columns are in then there will be no issues in the future.

This also comes at a time when we have to fundraise for around £45000 to repair/refurbish the Play Park. Applications are already going in for any funds that may be available but, again, all offers of help and ideas for events to fundraise will be grateful received.

Organisation for the Bonfire Night and Quiet Fireworks are going well and tickets selling. If you know anyone who may be driving to the event please let them know that enforceable parking restrictions will be in place so limited parking around the village. We are trying to avoid the blocking of the roads around the village this year!

There will be some tree work being done by Western Power in the bottom right hand corner of the cemetery to clear greenery away from the electricity pole.

The meeting was closed at 7.50 p.m. The date of the next meeting is Monday 17 November at 6.30. All are welcome.

### **SNICKERDOODLES**

### For the dough


230 g Salted butter (room temp)
300 g granulated sugar
2 large eggs
440 g plain flour (GF works as picture shows)
1 tsp Bicarbonate of Soda
3 tsp Cream of Tartar
1 tsp vanilla essence
70 g broken up chunks of fudge (Optional)



80 g granulated sugar 2 tbsp ground cinnamon (I also used ground almonds and made some of both)

#### Method

Prehead the over to 180 C fan Prepare large baking sheets with baking paper.



Next add the flour, bicarbonate of soda, cream of tartar and broke up fudge chunks if using. Mix until a stiff dough forms. Then divide the dough into ping-pong side balls and set aside.

In a small bowl mix the sugarand cinnamon together then, one by one, drop in the dough balls and cover completely with the sugar and cinnamon.

Place onto a prepared baking sheet leaving at least 2 inches apart as they expland. Bake in the middle of the oven for 10-12 minutes and then remov and allow to cool.


