## Lambley Nature 2025: October Wildlife Tips

- The wildlife websites have some great tips for encouraging wildlife into your garden! Think of buying a cheap trail camera – you will be surprised how much wildlife you have.
- Fill your space with plants! Wildflower meadows and lawns can be sown if its rained, as well as early spring bulbs planted and preparations made for native bare-rooted trees and roses!.
- Crab apple trees are not only colourful but nature friendly – the bonus is you can make crab apple jelly from many of these. Damson trees for jams.
- The rain finally arrived in mid Sept – think of buying and installing a large water butt, we may need these – capture of fresh water is so important if we are to have these dry Summers. Dig out a small pond, clean birdbaths. Water wildlife of all types! You can fence it off if you have small children or dogs with green wire netting and the amphibians will be safe from predators, domestic or wild. Newts get trapped inside water filters try to get a solar filter if you can. Don't stock your wildlife pond with fish they will eat your tadpoles.
- Nature likes areas that are not tidy! Seedheads offer food for birds and habitat for insects. They can also look [really pretty!](#) Pile up leaves, twigs and logs in corners or under bushes to make a log pile. If you have room create a “dead hedge” in a secluded corner of the garden. You may be fortunate to attract a hedgehog into it. Details of how to construct it are on the RSPB or Woodland Trust page.
- This is the time to cut your wildflower meadow as Reed Pond will do, most flowers will have seeded, rake off and compost arisings from the final cut as if left it adds nutrients to the soil and wildflowers thrive on nutrient deficient soil but nettles and thistles will.

As the weather becomes cooler, fill up your birdfeeders! You could also clean out existing nestboxes but observe first at dusk if birds like wrens and tits are using them to roost over Winter and take the opportunity to install some more boxes!

## A BIRD DIARY: Sightings in a Lambley Garden

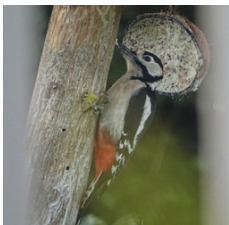
I first became interested in recognising different species of birds when I was a child in the 1950s . At that time, you could collect a series of small picture cards which came free in each packet of Brooke Bond PG Tips looseleaf tea. The cards were numbered and could be stuck into a small album ( Bird Portraits : A series of British Birds illustrated and described by CF Tunnicliffe R. A.) which could be purchased for an old sixpence( 6D). Sometimes we took these cards to school to trade ' swaps ' with other pupils in an attempt to complete a collection before the subject matter changed.

When, four years ago, I moved from the suburbs of Nottingham to Lambley, I was immediately struck by the wide open skies and a consequently different view of birds in a more countryside setting .The dawn chorus seemed louder and the garden was larger, bordered by mixed hedging , with a tall Christmas Tree and an old Weeping Birch providing cover .

Early in 2023, we decided to create a 'Bird Sightings' record book, a kind of diary, with handwritten lists of birds seen in our garden together with dates . From time to time, I added a list of visitors suggested by the Merlin App which identifies birds from their recorded songs . I started to recognise some particular sounds, like the loud noise made by the tiny wren for example.

Our book has been an unending source of interest with its occasional bird photos and commentary to look back on . We can compare dates of sightings and behaviour from year to year too.

Woodpeckers have been of special interest to us . In 2023 we first caught sight of The Green Woodpecker stripping all the bark from our rustic bird table. In August 2024 a family of four Green Woodpeckers (2 adults 2 juveniles) flew in and proceeded to feast on the ants living in the cracks of an old brick base . In June 2025 we have recorded several visits made by a family of 3 Great Spotted Woodpeckers (2 adults 1 juvenile ) ,with their striking black/white/red plumage, enjoying peanuts and fat balls on the feeders in the Christmas Tree, making for a memorable entry in the book.

Overhead we have seen Red Kites , Kestrels , Buzzards , Herons and many a skin of honking geese . Our front garden has been graced by dive bombing swallows who gather on the phone wires later in the year ready to make their incredible journey to Africa . Pheasants , red legged partridges and quail have been observed exploring the flower beds.

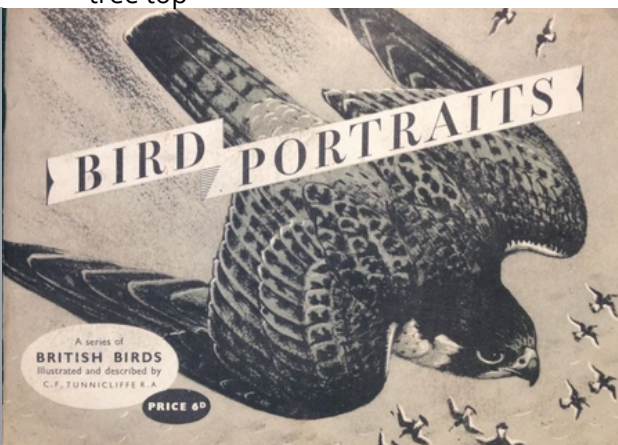
And then , of course , there is the daily list of the usual suspects , far too many to mention here , ranged from the top to the bottom of the tree like a poster of Who's Who in The Bird World . I like to think that learning the names of birds, wild flowers and butterflies remains an interesting occupation for children and The Big Garden Bird Watch each January is a good starting point with free ID charts and information to support bird counting.

My knowledge of birds is still limited, but growing . I am keen to recognise the wonderfully named Spotted Flycatcher which keeps turning up on my Merlin lists.

I would recommend starting a notebook of sightings to anyone who has a few minutes to look through the window to catch sight of a blackbird singing its heart out or a robin digging for worms or a charm of goldfinches being charming . It becomes more rewarding than you might guess. **Julia Brown**

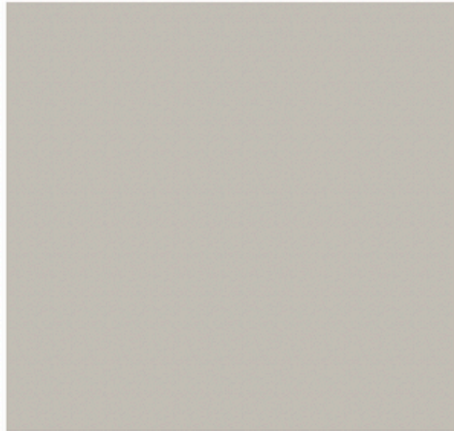
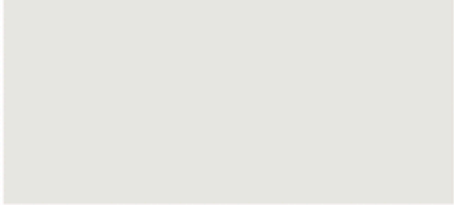

It was a great event and takes a lot of time and planning by the organisers and we would like to thank all the Show Committee members. The Reed Pond Nature Reserve gratefully received a donation of £1000 from the proceeds of last year's show which will be put towards work to enhance the pond.



We would also like to thank Ken Platt, one of many people who donated on the day, who generously gave £40.00. All money raised will go towards work at the Reed Pond Nature Reserve. Our new display board giving details of the Reed Pond Reserve's past present and future was also on display and attracted a lot of interest along with our information leaflet about how to get involved.

# Calling All Volunteers - Our Next Volunteer Event – Reed Pond Rake-Up

Our annual Reed Pond Rake-Up this year will take place on **Saturday 4th October** and **Sunday 5th October**. We may not need both days to complete the work, and the dates are subject to dry weather. Any volunteers attending the event please check out of Facebook page for updates, Lambley Reed Pond Nature Reserve.

You will need to bring with you a rake and gloves. Wheelbarrows are useful too if you have one. We have two sessions on each day 10am-1pm and 1pm-4pm. Tea/Coffee and homemade cakes will be provided on both days. Any children attending must be supervised by their parent/guardian. All children that attend will get a free packet of sweets.

We are once again enlisting the support of Tom Smith's tractor/trailer on the day to help pile the grass cuttings in parts of the reserve and thank him for his generous support to a much-loved village asset.

## Why do we have an Annual Rake-Up?

By piling the grass cuttings in the reserve, we create further habitats. When the grass piles break down, they create warm insulated nests for hedgehogs as well as being a valuable area for different types of fungi to grow. The reason we rake up the grass is to prevent the enrichment of soil which can promote the growth of nettles and coarse grasses and help the germination of less competitive wildflowers.

## NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Mobile Phone Theft and how you can avoid this happening

It is reported that a mobile phone is stolen every hour in some areas of the UK.

With this in mind, we have put together some top tips to help keep your mobile safer. Our mobile phone's value is more than just monetary, they contain our personal data, our social account, our banking details and our treasured photos of our loved ones. Priceless.

1. Stay aware in public spaces Thieves often target people who are distracted (e.g. texting while walking or standing by bus/train stops). Keep your phone out of sight in crowded areas like high streets, public transport, or outside bars/clubs.
2. Use secure carrying methods Avoid keeping your phone in back pockets or loosely in your hand. Use a zipped bag or front pocket, ideally with the opening facing inward when in a crowd.
3. Enable security features Set up a strong PIN, password, fingerprint, or facial recognition. Register your device's IMEI number (by dialling \*#06#) with your network provider; this makes it easier to block if stolen.
4. Be cautious at hotspots for theft Phone theft is common near transport hubs, tourist attractions, and busy nightlife areas in UK cities like London, Manchester, and Birmingham. Avoid displaying your phone when standing near open train doors, escalators, or while cycling.
5. Use tracking and backup services Activate "Find My iPhone" (Apple) or "Find My Device" (Android). Regularly back up important data, so if your phone is stolen, you won't lose personal information. Central support update.

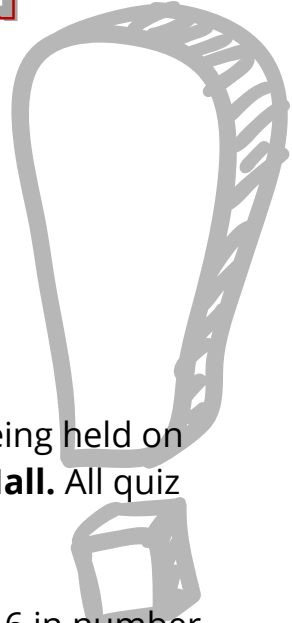
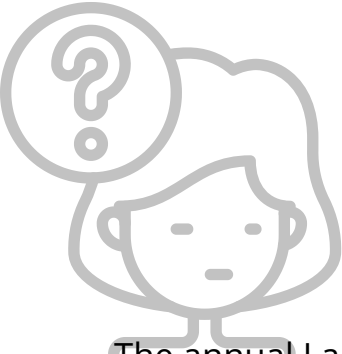
## DIGITAL SWITCH-OVER

All our landlines are going digital – your phone operator will have a Team who can inform you of what Digital Voice is and why this change is necessary.

Persons affected will be the people who use a healthcare alarm or medical pendant which allows you to press for help in an emergency or a burglar alarm linked to your landline. You will need to check with your landline provider about any needed upgrades before the switch.

# LAMBLEY PARISH COUNCIL – WHAT IS HAPPENING AT THE MOMENT

## Parish Council Report September 2025

The Parish Council met on Monday 15th September.

We listened to a report from Bonnie Bramwell about the work of the Reed Pond Committee and their future plans. They have recently secured a grant which will enable them to do a lot more work around the pond making it an even more delightful place to visit. Please consider volunteering to help with this very worthwhile project. The Council thanked the committee for their efforts.

We were also visited by Dawn Edwards, our former Chair, who explained that the Trent Rivers Trust had completed work on the leaky dams in the Top Dumble. We are hoping that these will help to protect the village from major flooding events. Dawn hopes that the profits from the excellent Village Show will pay for the work but the Parish Council has underwritten the costs. Please tell your children about the leaky dams. I can imagine that children playing in the Dumbles could be tempted to modify/destroy them without realising the impact this might make.

We received reports from Cllr Jodie Stoll (NCC) and Cllr Helen Greensmith (GBC). It was disappointing to hear that NCC are recommending that the whole of Gedling Borough be incorporated into the new Greater Nottingham along with Nottingham City and Broxtowe Borough. We think that the rural areas of Gedling should be excluded from Greater Nottingham as do Nottingham City Council. The Local Development Plan for Gedling continues to arouse plenty of discussion. The Parish Council wrote an objection response to the plans and await to hear the result of the debate at GBC on the 17th September.

The County Council, through their highways team at VIA, have made a decision that Christmas lights can no longer be powered by roadside lamp columns. This would mean that we will have to install separate power columns for each of our eight Christmas light sets at a cost of around £15000.

After protracted discussions, NCC have agreed to allow us to continue for this year but we will be unable to fund the new power columns for next year without financial assistance from other sources. The Christmas light switch-on will take place, as usual, on 1st December.

Two new initiatives have been agreed for the cemetery. We are going to set aside an area for the interment of cremated remains.

These will not require a full plot and will be able to have a small memorial plaque on them. We are also going to install a memory tree in the Reed Pond Reserve where small memorial plaques will be able to be placed. More details will be published in due course.

The Council is considering organising an Open Gardens event next summer. If you would like to take part in this, we would be pleased to hear an expression of interest. Please let us know.

Finally, a big thank you to all who helped organise the Village Show and to all of you who came along. It was a fantastic event.

1 egg

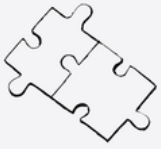

## Jobs in the garden for October

1. Clear up fallen leaves from the garden and especially from ponds, lawns and beds.
2. Take cuttings of currants and gooseberries and dig up rooted layers of blackberries and hybrid berries such as tayberries.
3. In mild areas you can sow overwintering broad beans in situ. Cover broad bean cloches to provide insulation in colder areas as well as protect from pigeons.
4. Plant out spring cabbages but remember to protect from the pigeons!
5. Plant autumn onion sets for a crop in early to mid-summer.
6. Plant garlic cloves.
7. Check stored apples regularly and remove any rotten fruit.
8. Keep an eye on brussel sprouts and remove any yellowing leaves to prevent grey mould.
9. Autumn is a good time to mulch under fruit trees and bushes.
