## Lambley Nature 2025: September Wildlife Tips

- Leave piles of leaves around your garden – don't bin or burn them! Fungi, bacteria and insects will love to consume, leaving behind a light compost, which can be used to enrich the soil – clever! Leaves are taken down into the soil by worms to add fertility to it.
- Yes, plastic bin bags have uses, when filled with leaves can be left in a dark corner creating its own humidity, newts and froglets enjoy living under the bags – children will see their first newt and get up close and personal to nature!
- If you have a black tarpaulin soak the ground under it first well and leave it out in the shade in your garden near the hedge boundary and toads will enjoy living under it in this hot weather.
- We have become just too tidy! Hedgehogs and frogs like long grass and scrub as habitat. Leave ivy and its flowers because they provide a great late source of nectar for any bees/insects and butterflies and bats will hibernate in ivy over the winter on trees.
- You could plant some native bulbs like bluebells or the native daffodil/lent lily as it flowers earlier than cultivated varieties in March for an early nectar source for newly emerged bees.
- A large bucket of water filled with rainwater some aquatic pondweed and a sunken mini water lily will attract a frog or make a water feature out of a half oak barrel sunk in the garden or a small sleeper box lined with pond liner sunken into the ground also works.
- Clean out old nest boxes only if you know they have been used – wrens will roost in them all Winter. A house martin nest-cup placed under the eaves or in an old shed have been occupied and you may attract them or swallows next April.
- Put up nesting boxes on an East or North facing wall and bat boxes in a dark area of your garden, bird boxes will attract potential occupants who will have time to before the nesting season arrives and could also use it for their roosting in Winter.
- Continue to feed birds and provide fresh water! This is essential now and change water at regular intervals. natural rainwater is at a premium. Purchase a water butt it will give you pure water at no cost and will save you a fortune if on a water meter.
- Think about buying live mealworms –insects and seeds are at a premium this Year these mealworms are far more successful than dried ones soaked. You can leave them in an old container, they don't usually escape and if they do, they will become click beetles another food source for starving birds moulting.

## JOHN EDWARD “EDDIE” BOWLER



John Edward Bowler – known to everyone as Eddie was born in North Somercotes, Lincolnshire in 1937 on 11 November – now known as Armistice Day.

His early childhood was spent between North Somercotes where his mother was from, and Carlton. With the outbreak of the 2nd World War, North Somercotes was used as a decoy base and he met many of the soldiers in the Green Howards, the Scots Guards and the Robin Hood/Sherwood Foresters Squadrons when they were off duty, as they all had camps in the area.

Eddie was a typical youngster and recalled having a happy and active childhood. He lived on a farm when in Lincolnshire and developed a love of the land and animals. He joined the Life Boys and the Boys Brigade in Carlton. In his early teens he joined the Railwayman’s Brass Band playing the flugelhorn and would walk to Colwick loco sheds band room to practice together. With another pupil he joined a choir and travelled to Birmingham to sing a duet which was recorded for radio. Aged 13-14 Eddie sang a solo of the hymn “God Who Created Me Nimble of Life and Limb” in Nottingham’s Albert Hall. He had a perfect pitch singing voice but could not be persuaded to join a male voice choir.

He attended Carlton Baptist Chapel, was a senior member of the Sunday School and became the Registrar. When the chapels all over the Midlands set a scripture exam, Eddie came top of all the boys. During the War, Eddie’s school years were at North Somercotes, but then he moved to Carlton Board School and Chandos Street, Netherfield. Leaving school at 15, he worked at Harrods Builders & Undertakers, completing a 5-year apprenticeship in joinery, obtaining City & Guilds qualification. His mother died when he was 16 and Eddie made her coffin. After her death, ill health precluded him from doing National Service.

He had hoped to do three years in the RAF but became a retained fireman for six years, taking his driving test on a fire engine!

Eddie worked for various builders on schools and housing projects, gaining supervisory position. He worked for the builder who developed Grange Close and go to know many of the Lambley families and much of the village history. An accident at work then forced his early retirement.

In 1958 Eddie met Susan Price from Gedling and they were married in December 1962. Susan was always dancing to live three piece bands so Eddie secretly took himself to Hanford & Richards and Jepsons in Nottingham to learn ballroom dancing. They lived in Carlton for five and a half years and moved to Lambley in 1968. They had a daughter in 1977 and a son in 1978 and during their school years Eddie was a school governor at Frank Seely Calverton and also Vice Chair of Lambley Parish Council.

Eddie's greatest passion was gardening. The garden was open for three consecutive years raising considerable amounts for charity. He kept ducks, geese and chickens. His father had kept pigs and poultry and Eddie wanted a pig and goats but thought he had better consider the neighbours. Latterly, he only had chickens, always referred to as "the girls". His roots were in Lincolnshire and he would frequently travel there for the day to buy Lincolnshire potatoes and vegetables and also enjoy the fish and chips.

Eddie was known as a cheerful character, always ready for a chat and always had a story to tell. Having a great sense of humour, it was difficult to hold a conversation with him without laughing at something.

He loved country and western and brass band music and always kept in touch with current affairs. He listened to the shipping forecast at 5.30 a.m. every morning and, if asked why he needed to know this, his reply was "I have to decide if I am going deep sea diving or abseiling today".

He loved camping, caravanning and walking holidays in the UK and he enjoyed family holidays in Florida with theme parks and, at nearly 80 in Cyprus, went paragliding. In recent years Ibiza was his favourite place and it was soon after the last trip there, that Eddie suffered a stroke and passed away peacefully in hospital with family at his side.

**May I say a huge thank you to my friends and neighbours in the village who have been so kind and supportive during this time of sadness.**

- Overspend of £106 which was made up by the Parish Council (thank you).

# The Reed Pond Ramblings

From the Lambley Reed Pond Group

Welcome to the September Edition of the Reed Pond Ramblings. The group have been busy this month in preparation for the Autumn/Winter activities in the nature reserve.

## Thriving in a Wilder Trent Project

Earlier this year the Reed Pond Committee was successful in securing a **£10,000** grant funded by the Species Survival Fund with match funding from Severn Trent Water and administered by Notts Wildlife Trust. The aim is to benefit numerous species associated with wetland habitats in the area.

The Lambley Reed Pond Committee will be using the money in three areas:

1. To remove some of the Alder trees within congested areas to allow further growth of the remaining trees and light in the understory. To remove trees which are infected with disease such as Ash trees.
2. To plant a diverse range of native plants both within the wooded area and close to the ponds edge to create a haven for insects and other pollinators, creating diversity and help encourage other species to thrive within the pond area. This will create a colourful attractive display of flowering plants throughout the year.
3. To look at ways forward to manage the reed bed effectively so that it is contained within certain areas of the pond and doesn't impact the views of the pond from the benches.

The Thriving in a Wilder Trent project sets out to create and restore habitat across the River Trent and will increase the populations of a huge range of waders, wildfowl, amphibians, reptiles, fish, mammals, plants and invertebrates. We are all really excited about improving the diversity of the Reed Pond Nature Reserve especially the planting the understory to the wooded area and pond marginals. We are looking to introduce native plants only such as bluebells, foxglove, wood anemone, primrose and honeysuckle and around the fringes of the pond species such as marsh marigolds, purple loosestrife and amphibious bistort.



## Grazing on the Nature Reserve

Once again sheep will be grazing on the reserve so, please observe all the signs, closing the gate behind you when you are entering to leaving the reserve. To protect the community orchard, it will be fenced using electric fencing so please do observe the warning signs, keep away from the area and dogs on leads.



The sheep have once again been kindly provided by Tony and Val. The sheep will graze the reserve throughout the last few weeks in August and possibly the first week in September. After the sheep leave the reserve, the area will be cut ready for our annual rake-up and as always, we really appreciate Andy Musson for all the help he provides supporting the Reed Pond Committee.

# Neighbourhood Watch – August / September 2025

When the weather is nice, everyone wants to be outside and enjoy the good weather. But crime rates tend to rise during the summer months, particularly in July August and early September. This increase is often attributed to factors like warmer weather, school holidays, and more people being outdoors. On the 4 July, the Home Office announced that shoppers and businesses will see increased police presence, stronger prevention and enforcement action by police and councils to support safer high streets this summer. Here's some pointers for how you can keep yourself safe too.

## **Street harassment**

The first rule is to prioritise your personal safety. Do not challenge harassers if they are threatening or you believe they may cause harm to you. If you see someone experience street harassment, and it is safe to do so, ask them 'are you ok?'. It can make a big difference to those who experience harassment by letting them know you stand by them, and that street harassment is never okay.

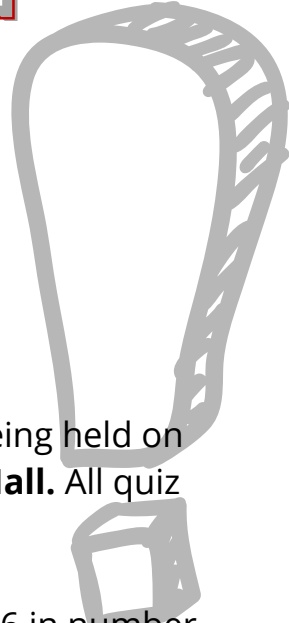
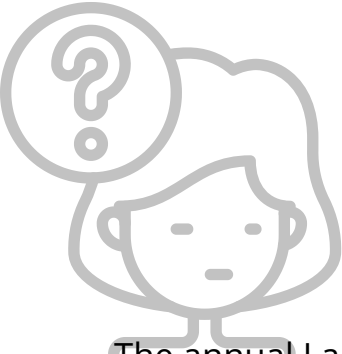
Find out more about how to intervene on our website. Phone theft Analysis shows phone theft claims in UK have risen by 425% since 2021. The best insurance is preparation and prevention. The Metropolitan Police advise using your phone for the shortest possible time on the street and avoid texting while walking. Criminals often use bikes or mopeds when snatching devices, so watch out for any nearby when using your phone and stand away from the roadside.

Keep your phone physically secure. You can use phone cases with straps or lanyards that attach to your wrist to help keep you connected to your phone. They're not 100% secure, but may act as a deterrent.

Switch on your phone's security features to protect your phone and use the keypad lock so that thieves cannot immediately access your phone or use the biometric authentication if your phone has it (fingerprint or facial recognition).

Pickpockets don't always operate alone, they may work in teams to distract the target while someone unseen removes the items and blends back into the crowd. Another member might step in as an enforcer in the event of an altercation.

Road & Pedestrian Safety: Catfoot Lane and other access roads are narrow, dangerous, and not suitable for large increases in traffic.

Add carrot and stir-fry for 2 minutes.

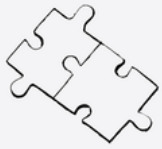
Blend the cornflour, soy sauce, sugar and spices together.

Add to the frying pan with chicken stock and sesame oil.

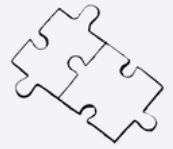
Bring to the boil, stir in spring onions and simmer, uncovered for 2 minutes or until meat is tender.

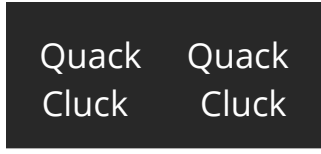


### **Overgrown vegetation/hedges etc**

## Jobs in the garden for September

1. Divide herbaceous perennials.
  2. Pick autumn raspberries.
  3. Collect and sow seeds from perennials and hardy annuals.
  4. Dig up remaining potatoes before slug damage spoils them.
  5. Net ponds before leaf fall gets underway.
  6. Keep up with watering of new plants, using rain or grey water if possible.
  7. Start to reduce the frequency of houseplant watering.
  8. Clean out coldframes and greenhouses so that they are ready for use in the autumn.
  9. Cover leafy vegetable crops with bird-proof netting.
  10. Plant spring flowering bulbs.
